THE A.D.A.P.T.™ CHANGE MANAGEMENT FRAMEWORK

A — Advise

Clarify the reason for change and help people understand the situation.

- Explain the current reality
- Communicate the business or organizational need
- Identify risks of not changing
- Help people understand what the change means

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- Address early confusion and misinformation

D — Devise

Design the change approach, communication plan, stakeholder strategy, and support mechanisms.

- Define the desired change outcome
- Identify affected stakeholders
- Map concerns, resistance, and support needs
- Prepare communication messages
- Plan training, coaching, resources, and transition support

A — Align

Create leadership, team, and stakeholder alignment around the change.

- Align leaders and managers on shared messages
- Clarify roles and responsibilities
- Engage influencers and change champions
- Connect the change to organizational priorities
- Build readiness and commitment

P — Promote

Encourage participation, ownership, and positive movement toward the change.

- Communicate progress and quick wins
- Recognize adoption and cooperation
- Address resistance constructively
- Encourage feedback and involvement
- Promote new behaviors and ways of working

T — Transition

Support people as they move from old practices to new expectations.

- Provide coaching, training, and reinforcement
- Remove barriers and resolve implementation issues
- Monitor adoption and performance
- Sustain new behaviors through accountability
- Review lessons learned and improve continuously

COMMON CHANGE MANAGEMENT MISTAKES COVERED

6. Giving different messages across departments

8. Failing to prepare supervisors to answer employee questions
9. Focusing only on implementation tasks, not people adoption
10. Launching new systems without enough training and support
11. Declaring success immediately after rollout
12. Forgetting to monitor behavior change after implementation
13. Punishing questions instead of listening to concerns
14. Allowing rumors to replace official communication
15. Failing to reinforce new behaviors after the transition
